FRIDAY JULY 1 IS CANADA DAY!

On July 1, 1867, Canada became a country. It was made up of four provinces: Nova Scotia; New Brunswick; Ontario; and Quebec.

The anniversary of this date was called Dominion Day until 1982. After 1982 July 1st became Canada Day.

In many towns and cities, municipal governments organize events, often outdoors. These include pancake breakfasts, parades, concerts, carnivals, festivals, firework displays and citizenship ceremonies for new Canadian citizens. Check your local municipality's website to find out what is going on near you.

Canada's national flag will be widely displayed and a lot of people paint their faces red and white, which are Canada's national colours.

July 1st is a statutory holiday in Canada which means many organizations, businesses and stores will be closed. All government offices will also be closed.

DID YOU KNOW ...?

Level 1 (Beginner)

The Niagara Falls are on the border of New York, (USA), and Ontario, (Canada).

They are made up of 3 waterfalls: The American Falls The Bridal Veil Falls The Horseshoe Falls.

Level 2 (Intermediate)

The Niagara Falls are located on the Niagara River.

The river drains water from Lake Erie to Lake Ontario.

The Falls are about 12,000 years old.

They were formed by glaciers.

The word Niagara comes from the word "onguiaahra" which means "a thundering noise".

Level 3 (Advanced)

It is illegal to go over the Falls. However, some daredevils have tried in the past, using customdesigned barrels. Some have succeeded, and others have died trying. The first person to successfully go over the falls in a barrel was Annie Taylor in 1901.

At the current rate of erosion, scientists believe that the Niagara Falls will be gone in about 50,000 years...so you still have time to see them! But don't go over them!

CANADIAN HISTORY & CULTURE CORNER

Totem poles are found in the Pacific Northwest - British Columbia. They are carved by First Nations people from cedar and depict the totem, or spirit of kin (family or ancestors), from the tribe.

The designs and customs around totem poles are quite complex. The figures include the members of the tribe, their status and the tribe's history as well as a mythological creature to look over the tribe. They show power and privilege.
