St. Patrick's Day

This day marks the death of St. Patrick. He was a missionary in Ireland who died on March 17th in the 5th century. He chased all the snakes away and brought Christianity to Ireland.

Today, March 17th is an opportunity to celebrate Irish culture. Many Canadians have Irish ancesters. Shamrocks, leprechauns and the colour green are symbols of this day.

DID YOU KNOW?...

Level 1 (Beginner)

The first bird you will see in the Spring is the Robin. They will have babies in Mav.



Level 2 (Intermediate)

Flocks of robins will start to return to southern Canada in late March or early April. Their eggs are 'robin's egg blue'. The first eggs will hatch in late May and the chicks are very hungry.

Level 3 (Advanced)

One of the first signs of Spring is the return of the Robin. The males return to southern Canada in late March or early April, and the females will arrive a week or so later. The females make the nests, and will lay their first eggs in early May. The chicks will hatch about 2 weeks later. The eggs are a vibrant blue. The young will fledge (leave the nest) when they are just 13 days old.



April 1st is April Fools Day

In many Western countries April 1 st is called *April Fools' Day*. It is a day when people play jokes on each other, or try to trick their friends and family.

A simple trick would be to change your friend's cell phone background image to a photo of a cracked screen. It is harmless but could be very funny to see the reaction!!

Easter Weekend is Friday April 3rd to Monday April 6th

Easter Weekend is made up of Good Friday, (April 3rd), Easter Sunday, (April 5th) and Easter Monday, (April 6th). In the Christian Faith, Good Friday marks the death of Jesus Christ and Easter Sunday celebrates the day he rose from the dead. Schools and many businesses are closed on Good Friday and Easter Monday.

Easter has also become a very commercialized holiday. Children are told that the Easter Bunny comes to their home on the Saturday night, and delivers a basket of candy and chocolate to them. These treats are often in the shape of bunnies or eggs. At times, there will be a small toy, like a ball or a skipping rope in the basket. Sometimes the treats are hidden and children have to search for them. This is called an Easter Egg Hunt. Other traditions include decorating eggs with colourful paints and getting together with family, attending church and having a special dinner. Younger children will usually have Easter themed activities in their school.
