Father's Day is on the 3rd Sunday of June. In 2014, this will be **Sunday June** 15th. On this day, we show appreciation for our fathers and/or the father figures in our lives. The Summer Season begins on this day, but the weather may not always feel like summer. In Canada, there could still be some cool days and nights.



The June Solstice occurs when the sun reaches its northernmost point and the Earth's North Pole is tilted directly towards the sun. On this day we will experience the most hours of daylight in the year – almost 17 hours. Sunrise is at 04:36 and sunset is at 20:03!

DID YOU KNOW?...

Level 1 (Beginner)

Canada has many lakes. No country has more. There was an ice age 10,000 years ago. Most of the lakes were made by glaciers.

Level 2 (Intermediate)

Canada has approximately 3 million lakes. This is more lakes than any other country in the world. An ice age 10,000 years ago created the vast majority of Canada's lakes.

Level 3 (Advanced)

Canada has the most lakes of any other country in the world. There are approximately 3 million lakes in Canada, of which over 31,000 have a surface area of 3 km or more, The last glaciation was responsible for shaping the lakes of present-day

Canada.

CANADA DAY IS TUESDAY JULY 1ST!!

On July 1, 1867, Canada became a self-governing dominion of Great Britain. It was made up of only 4 provinces: Nova Scotia, New Brunswick, Ontario and Quebec. Canada is now made up of 10 provinces and 3 territories.

The anniversary of this date was called Dominion Day until 1982. Since 1983, July 1 has been officially known as Canada Day.

Canadians celebrate this day with fireworks in the evening. Most cities and towns will host community events with activities for the whole family. People often wear red and white as they are the official colours of Canada. As well, special citizenship ceremonies will take place on this day. Most businesses and organizations will be closed on this day. Be sure to check the Event Guide or newspaper in your community to see what fun activities are planned for this day in parks and public squares in your area.
