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

Then, it rained for forty days and forty nights. At the end of forty days, God daubed a rainbow in the sky. The rainbow is God's promise to humans that he will never again flood the earth.

Level 3 (Advanced)

Rainbows are generated when light is 'refracted', or bent, while travelling through a rain drop. This rain drop acts as a prism and separates the white beam of light into its component colours. This happens because different colours of light have different frequencies which means they travel at dissimilar speeds. This refraction causes a phenomenon, called a rainbow.

CANADIAN HISTORY & CULTURE CORNER

Oak Island Nova Scotia



Do you know the legend of buried pirate treasure in Canada? Oak Island, Nova Scotia is a great place to hide illicit loot!

In 1795, a boy found a depression in the ground and started to dig there. As he and his friends dug, they got more and more excited. They found layers of logs making walls of a pit. Was treasure buried here?!

More people came to explore this spot. It was called the Money Pit. 17th century pirates may have buried their treasure at Oak Island! Perhaps this was the lost treasure of the notorious Captain Kidd, himself! Captain Kidd and his motley crew looted the Caribbean and often

stopped on Canada's coast returning to England.

Over the past 200 years, many treasure hunters have tried to find the treasure. 6 men have died digging at Oak Island. They think the pirates wanted to protect the treasure and left *booby traps*.
